- 72,248 students enrolled in at least one AP course in Georgia public high schools during the 09-10 academic year
- 126,506 number of student enrollments in AP courses in Georgia public high schools during the 09-10
- 63,597 number of students in Georgia public high schools who took AP exams in May of 2010 (14% of students did not take AP exams)
- 104,539 total number of AP exams taken in May of 2010 by Georgia public high school students

Georgia had the fourth greatest one-year increase in the number of public school AP exam-takers and in the number of AP exams administered when compared to all other states from 2009 to 2010...Georgia's number of exam takers increased 13.4% over 2009; the national increase was 9.5%; the number of AP exams administered in Georgia increased 14.4% over 2009, compared to a national increase of 10.2%

Georgia had the sixth greatest one-year increase in the number of AP exams receiving grades of 3-5...Georgia's number of exams receiving grades of 3-5 increased 11.4% over 2009; the national increase was 8.3%

The 7th Annual AP Report to the Nation, February 2011:

- ranks Georgia 11th in the percentage of seniors in the Class of 2010 scoring 3 or higher in AP exams;
- indicates that 37.3% of seniors in Georgia took at least one AP exam during high school compared to the national average of 28.3%;
- ranks Georgia 5th in the % of seniors who take at least one AP exam during high school;
- ranks Georgia 3rd in the % of Black/African American students receiving 3 or higher on at least one AP exam taken during high school;
- ranks Georgia among the top 12 states leading the nation in strong AP programs and exemplary practices for building and growing quality AP for all students.
- The number of AP exams taken by Georgia's public school students has increased 75% since 2005 and the number of AP exams receiving grades of 3-5 has increased 66% since 2005
- The state average % for grades of 3-5 in May of 2010 was 50%
- The number of African American students in Georgia public schools participating in AP exams has increased 102% since 2005
- 34% of Georgia's African American public school AP exam takers received a grade of 3 or higher on at least one AP
 exam
- The number of Hispanic students in Georgia's public schools participating in AP exams has increased 176% since 2005
- 74% of Georgia's Hispanic public school AP exam takers received a grade of 3 or higher on at least one AP exam
