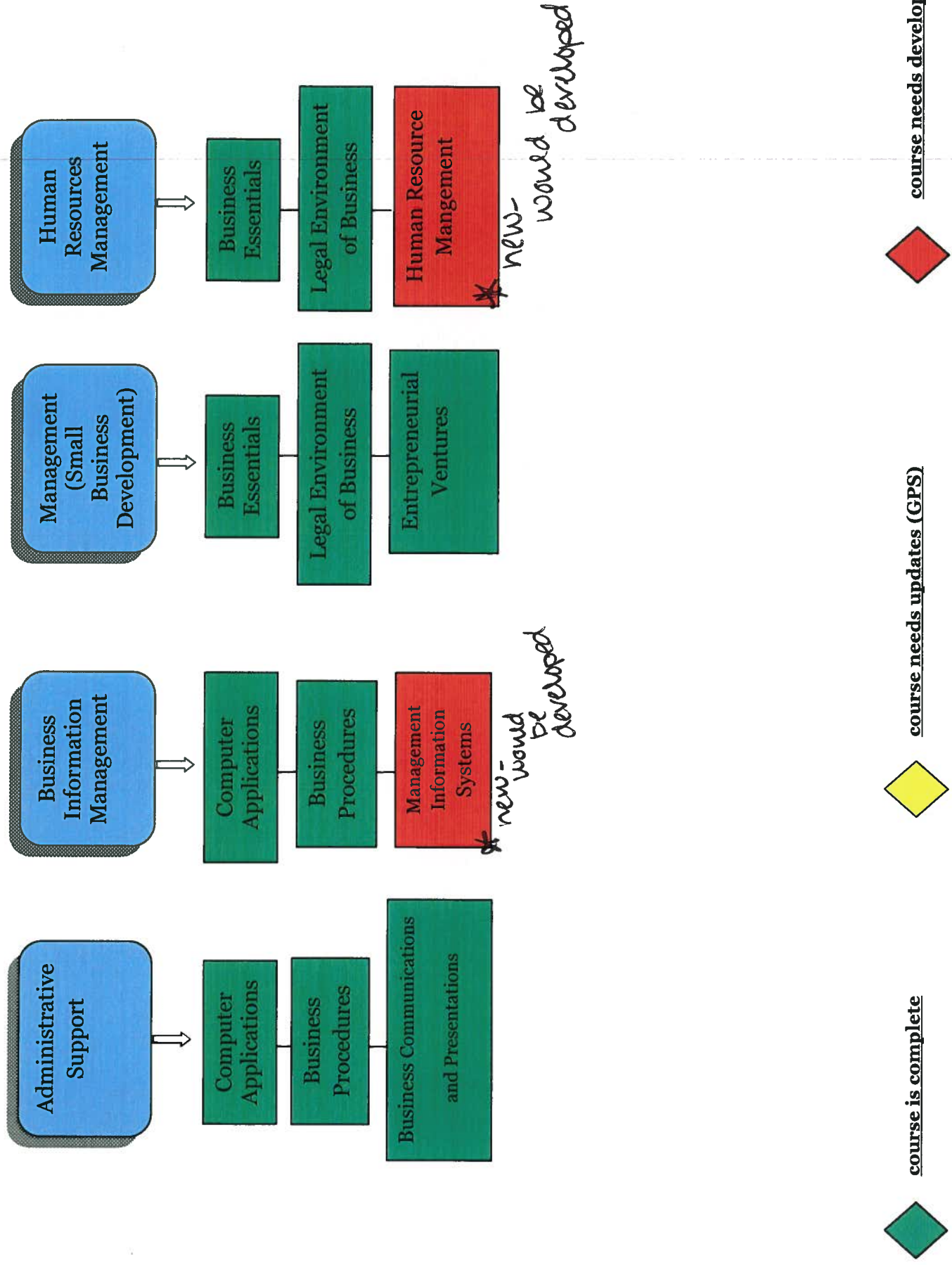

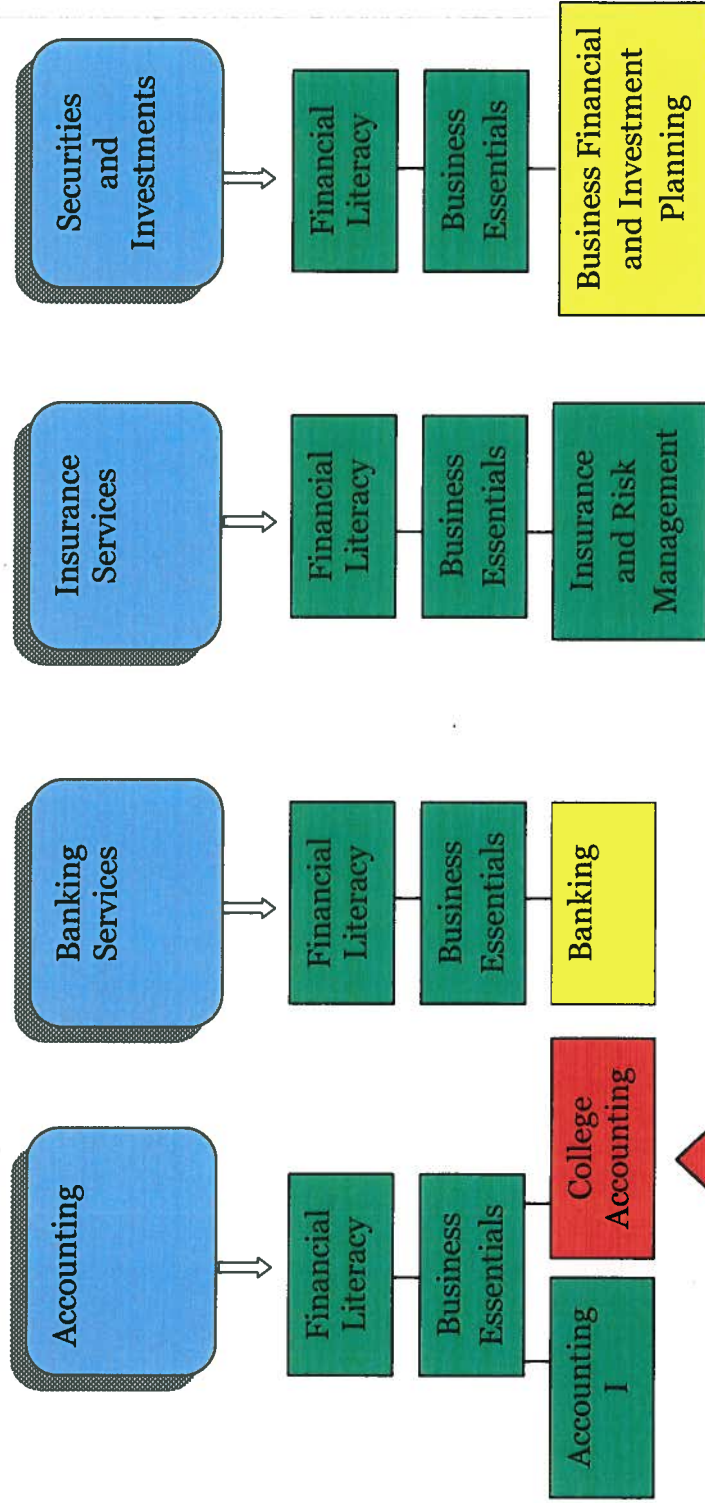
Peach State Pathways conversion to National Career Cluster

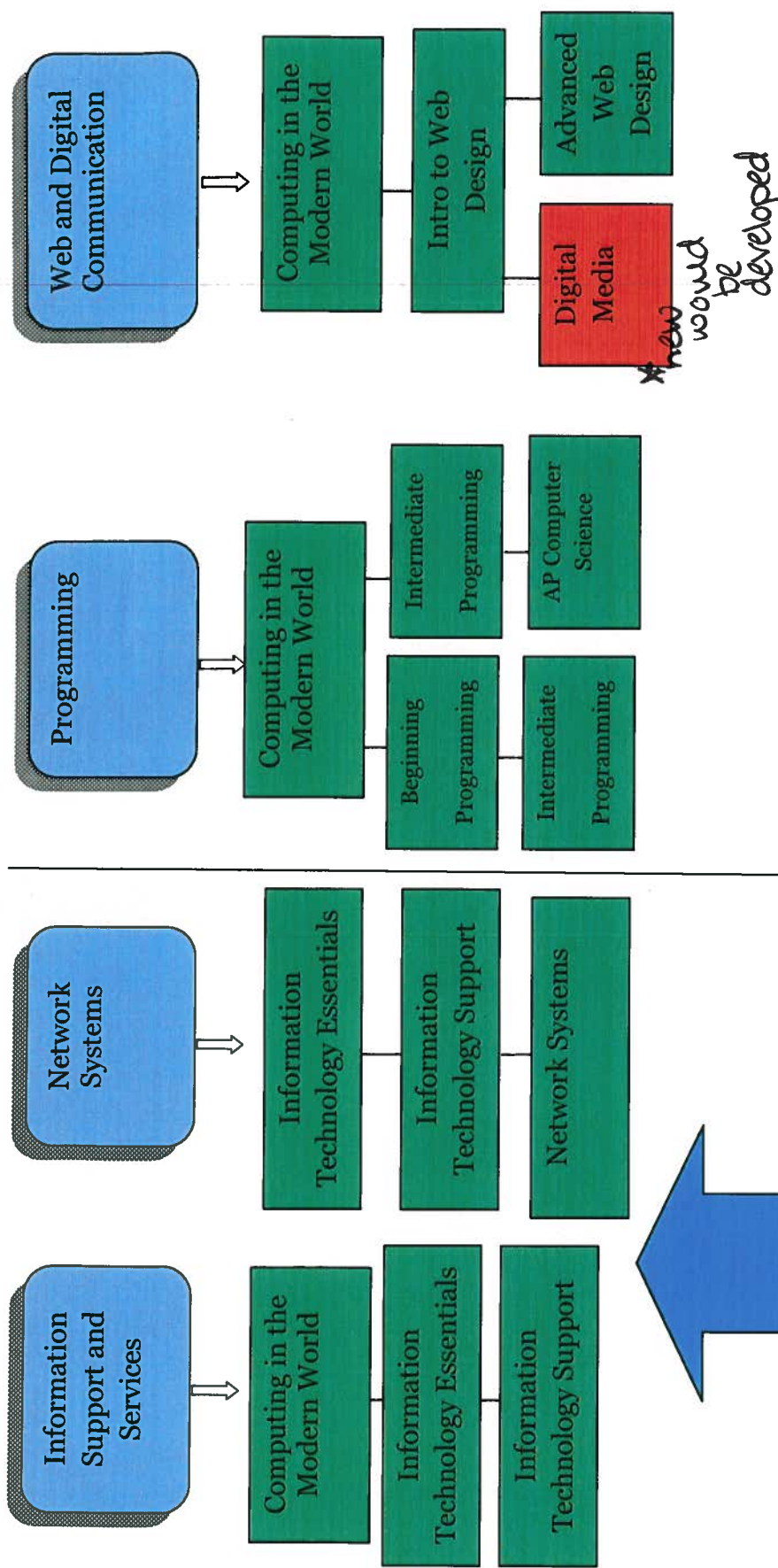

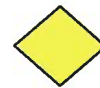

FAMILY ECONOMICS & FINANCIAL EDUCATION (FEFE) CURRICULUM

FEFE has seven types of curriculum materials designed by educators, for educators. Every FEFE lesson has been developed and evaluated in collaboration with current classroom educators, the FEFE National Master Educator team, to ensure that the materials are engaging, effective, and relevant for the audience participants. In addition, FEFE lessons are:

- **Activity based** using the **multiple intelligences** to engage students throughout the learning process;
- **Up-to-date and research-based** as a result of ongoing collaborations with FEFE staff, Master Teachers, and the Research Advisory Council;
- All lessons are available **free-of-charge** from www.fefe.arizona.edu;
