SUBJECT: End-of-Course Tests (EOCT) Nominations of Educators for Content Review

The Georgia Department of Education (GaDOE) is seeking recommendations for highly qualified educators to participate in our upcoming Georgia End-of-Course Tests (EOCT) Content Review Workshop. This meeting is scheduled for **October 25th & 26th, 2011**. The sessions will be held from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., at a hotel in the Atlanta area. The sessions will consist of reviewing new items that will be field tested on the EOCT in the future. This is a vitally important process to ensure the validity and reliability of Georgia's End-Of-Course Tests. We need your best educators.

To ensure that an adequate representation of educators from around Georgia is selected, System Test Coordinators and/or System Curriculum Coordinators should submit the names of qualified teachers in Ninth Grade Literature and Composition, American Literature and Composition, Biology, Physical Science, Economics/Business/Free Enterprise, US History, Mathematics I and Mathematics II.

For the review of Mathematics I and Mathematics II, please submit the names of teachers who are familiar with both subjects.

We are also seeking highly qualified educators in special education and ESOL.

You may submit up to three nominations per system. Please consider educators from your system who:

- 1) Demonstrate depth of knowledge in their content area
- 2) Demonstrate instructional expertise
- 3) Increase student achievement through the use of proven research-based practices
- 4) Participate in ongoing professional learning including GPS training
- 5) Provide leadership among their colleagues
- 6) Represent the ethnic and regional diversity of your system
- 7) Teach diverse and/or exceptional student populations, including vision and hearing impaired students
- 8) Receive recognition for their contributions to teaching and learning
- 9) Bring a fresh perspective to the EOCT development process

"Making Education Work for All Georgians"

To ensure a balanced, representative committee, not all nominees will be selected. Those nominees not selected for the meeting will be included in a pool from which the Assessment Administration Division staff may select individuals for participation in other future events related to the EOCT. Systems are encouraged to nominate first time participants. All nominees should be approved by a School Administrator and the System Testing Coordinator before registering for the workshop.

Please submit nominations between August 23 – September 2, 2011. To nominate teachers, go to the on-line registration site, CVENT, by following this link:

Participants will be notified the week of September 5th, 2011 if they are selected to participate in this event. Once selected, participants will be contacted with hotel and registration information. Reimbursements for substitute teachers (where appropriate), mileage at the rate of \$0.51 per mile, accommodations, and per diem expenses will be provided for qualifying participants. Breakfast and lunch will be provided to participants. The dinner reimbursement cost is capped at \$20.00.
