Overview

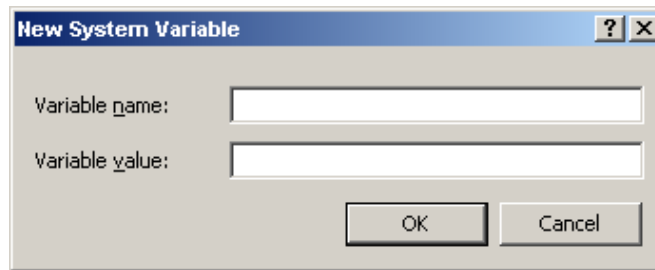
PCGenesis requires that certain Windows® server environment variables be set to facilitate the correct operation of various system functions such as the installation of the periodic software releases. Setting these environment variables helps to identify the Operating System (OS) such as Windows® 2003 or Windows® 2008 to ensure the commands function correctly.

Procedure A: Windows® 2003 Server Environment Variables

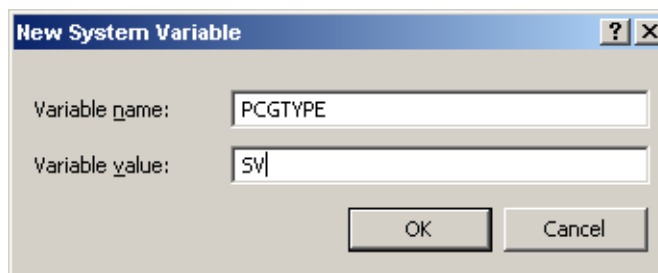
A1. Windows® 2003 PCGTYPE Environment Variables

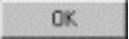
Step	Action

2	Select Properties → Advanced → Environment Variables → System Variables → New .

3	Enter the following information: Variable Name: PCGTYPE Variable Value: SV

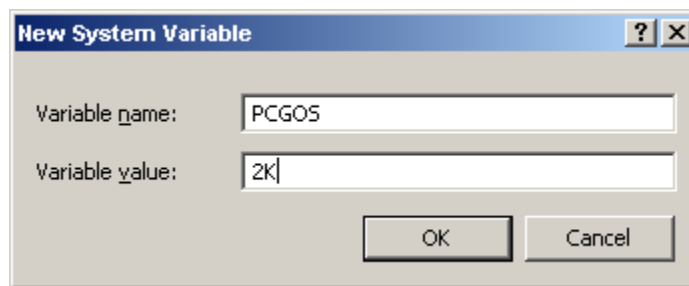


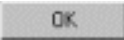

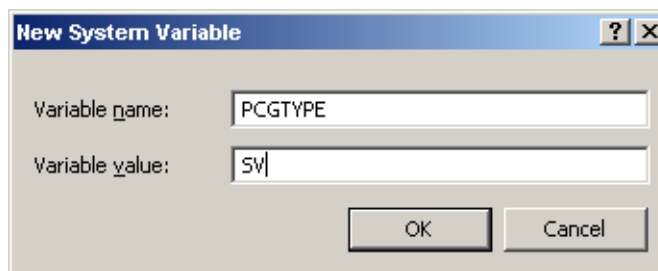

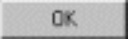
