This is an appeal by Lancelot Thornton (Appellant) from a decision by the Atlanta Board of Education (Local Board) to accept the recommendation of a Professional Practices Commission Tribunal that his contract as an elementary music teacher should be terminated because he engaged in inappropriate and unprofessional behavior with a female student of the Atlanta Public Schools when he attempted to withdraw the student from a school by posing as the student's guardian. Appellant claimed during the hearing before the Tribunal that a student-teacher relationship did not exist because the student was not enrolled in Appellant's school and Appellant had acted as a surrogate godfather for the student since the student was in the fourth grade and he was simply trying to assist the student because of a bad home situation. The Local Board claimed that Appellant failed to exercise professional judgment because he did not use the proper channels to obtain help for the student. As a result, the Local Board claimed that Appellant could not be effective as a music instructor where he has to chaperon students on trips. Appellant failed to file a brief with the State Board of Education or request oral arguments. Because Appellant failed to pursue his appeal, the appeal is dismissed.
