This is an appeal by Susan B. Steffey (Appellant) following the Forsyth County Board of Education's decision not to grant her a hearing regarding a grievance she had filed against her principal. Appellant claims that the Local Board violated state law by not providing her a hearing, thus depriving her of due process. The appeal is dismissed because the State Board of Education lacks jurisdiction in the absence of a hearing by the Local Board.

O.C.G.A. § 20-2-1160 permits appeals to the State Board of Education from decisions made by local boards of education after a hearing. O.C.G.A. § 20-2-1160(b)(Michie, 1996 ed.). In the absence of a hearing, the State Board of Education lacks jurisdiction to consider the appeal. See, Boney v. County Board of Education of Telfair County, 203 Ga. 152, 45 S.E.2d 442 (1947). In addition, the grievance procedures contained in O.C.G.A. §§ 20-2-989.5 et seq. do not grant independent jurisdiction to the State Board of Education. See, Kelly v. Gwinnett Cnty. Bd. of Educ., Case No. 1996-68 (Ga. SBE, Apr. 10, 1997).

Based upon the foregoing, it is the opinion of the State Board of Education that it lacks jurisdiction to consider Appellant's appeal because the Local Board did not conduct a hearing. Accordingly, the appeal is hereby DISMISSED.
