## TESTING BRIEF Winter 2008 Grade 8 Writing Assessment January 16 -17, 2008

Georgia law (O.C.G.A. §20-2-281) states "writing assessments shall be administered to students in grades three, five, eight, and eleven." The purpose of the Grade 8 Writing Assessment is to assess student achievement in the Georgia Performance Standards in writing and to improve writing and writing instruction. The Grade 8 Writing Assessment provides predictive information to eighth graders about their future writing performance in advance of taking the Georgia High School Writing Test (GHSWT).

The percentage of student examinees achieving the Meets and Exceeds standards in 2008 ranged from 7 percent for Mild Intellectually Disabled students to 89 percent for Asian students. The mean scale scores for student examinees in 2008 ranged from a 148 for students with Mild Intellectual Disability to a 227 for Asian students. Gains in percent of students Meeting or Exceeding Standards increased from 2007 in all groups, with the greatest gains in English Language Learner (ELL) and Hispanic students (15 percentage points) followed by Special Education and Male students (14 percentage points). The greatest scale score increase from 2007 was with ELL students (174 to 184).

The scale score range for the Grade 8 Writing Assessment is 100 to 350. Writing scores are also reported in the following performance levels: Does Not Meet (100-199), Meets (200-249), and Exceeds (250-350).

## **Key Findings**

- A total of 119,716 students were assessed in the 2008 Grade 8 Writing Assessment. Seventy-seven (77) percent of all students achieved the Meets or Exceeds standards set for writing with a mean scale score of 212. This group includes all students with scorable papers.
- A total of **12,617** Special Education students were assessed in writing. Forty-one (**41**) percent of students achieved the Meets or Exceeds standards set for writing with a mean scale score of **185**.
- A total of **2,604** English Language Learner students were assessed in writing. Forty (40) percent of students achieved the Meets or Exceeds standards set for writing with a mean scale score of **184**.
