 Increase graduation rate for students with disabilities who receive a general education diploma






 Decrease the dropout rate for students with disabilities

40% Female 60% Male







- **2**009-2010
 - Must find a way to distribute the valuable tools and materials to a broader GA audience with fewer resources.
- **2**010-2011
 - Cohort I reduced support
 - Cohort II continue with team leader support
 - Scale-up

Scaling Up GraduateFIRST

Pilot

17 High Schools

Cohort I

34 High Schools & the Feeder Middle Schools

Cohort II

- 84 High Schools and Middle Schools
- Collaboration Coaches work with Team Leaders at each school

Scale Up

- 450 participants (45 participants at 10 regional sites)
- Collaboration Coaches work with participants and team leaders

Year 4 Scale-Up

- 4 5 days of training with participants at regional sites....develop PLCs
- NDPC-SD and/or CC present modules in half day sessions via technology which will be archived
- CCs facilitate PLCs in discussion, data dig, and action plan development in afternoons following the broadcast
