- A state-wide IEP solution combining the power of Technology and the local Special Education departments throughout the state

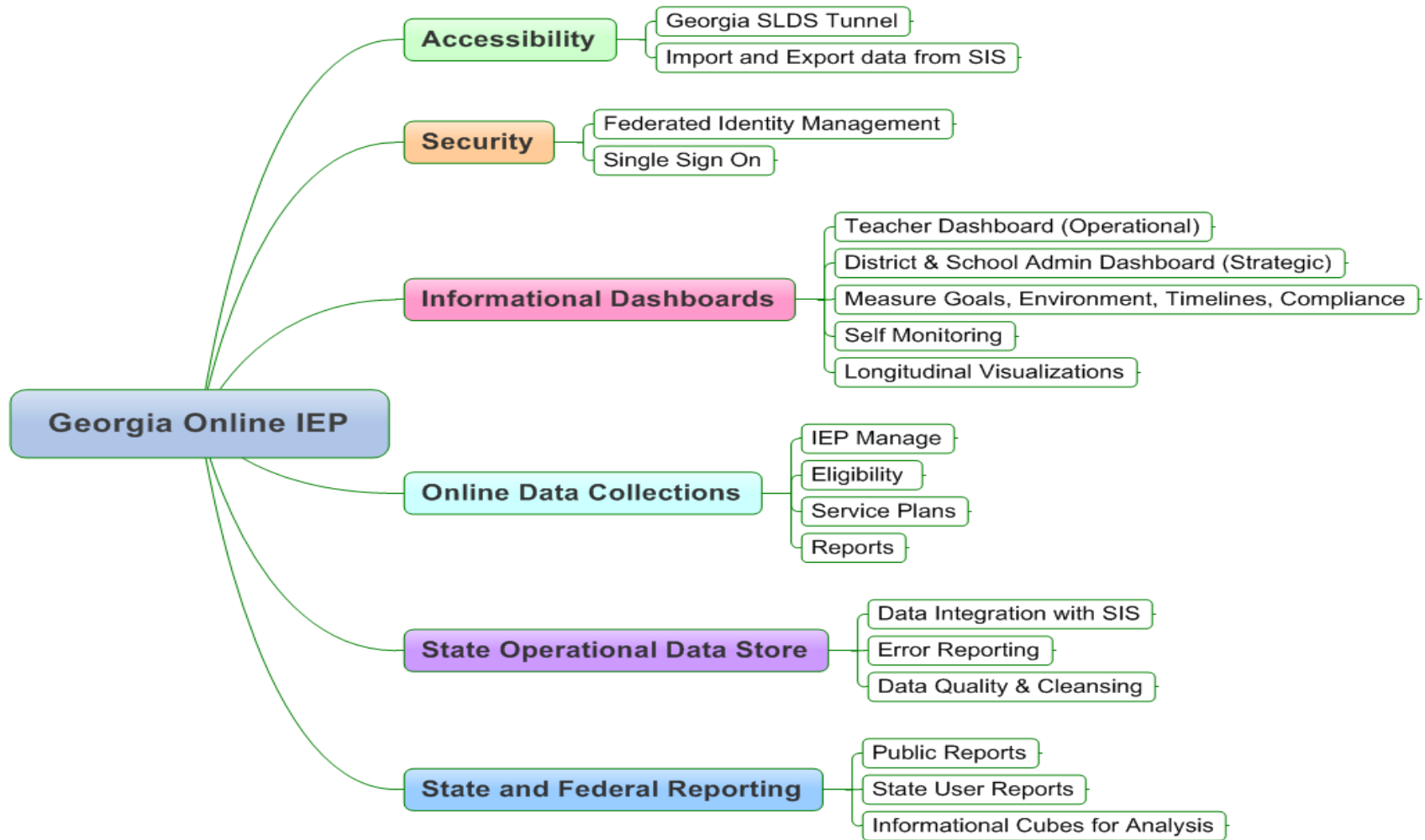
# Georgia Online IEP

# Georgia Online IEP

## How local districts benefit directly

- Real-time access to student IEP data
  - Access any IEP record, any time
  - Access by multiple teachers and administrators based on access rights
  - Availability of reports and indicator data
  - Integrated with the SLDS system
  - IEP available on incoming Georgia students

- Reduced burden & expense on LEA
  - Some reporting requirements automated
  - Inter-district transfers streamlined
  - State funded & supported

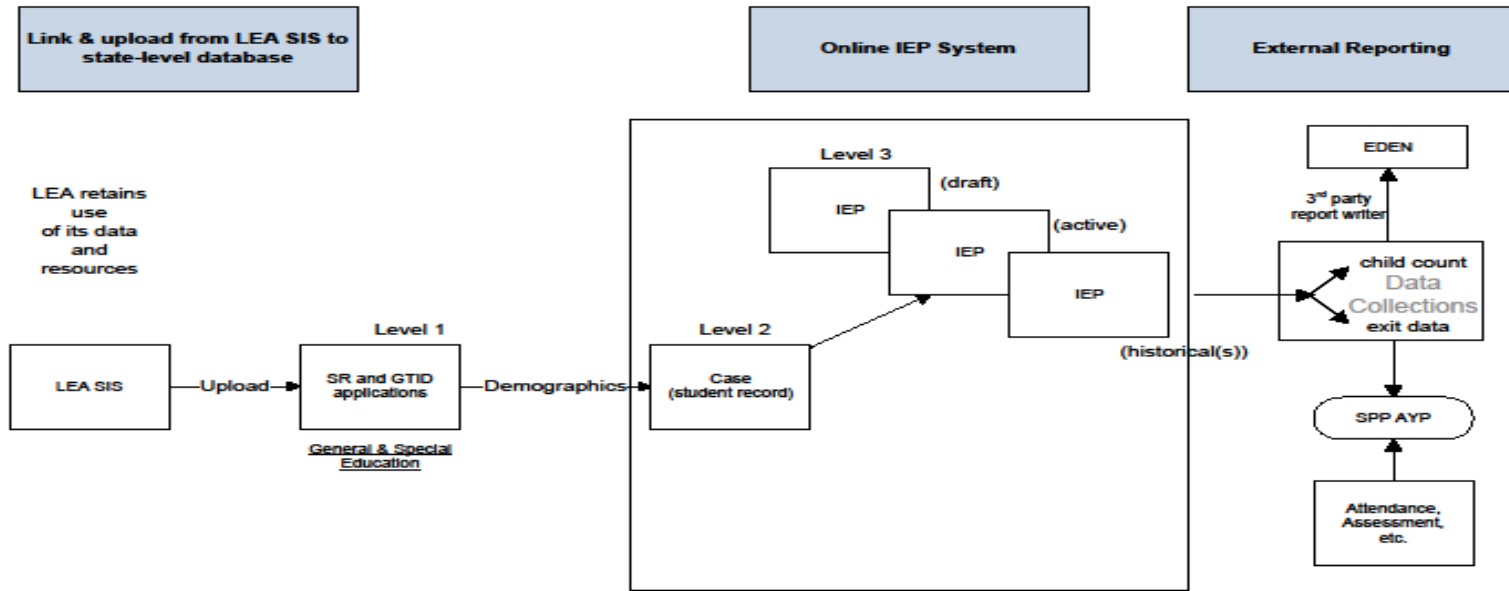

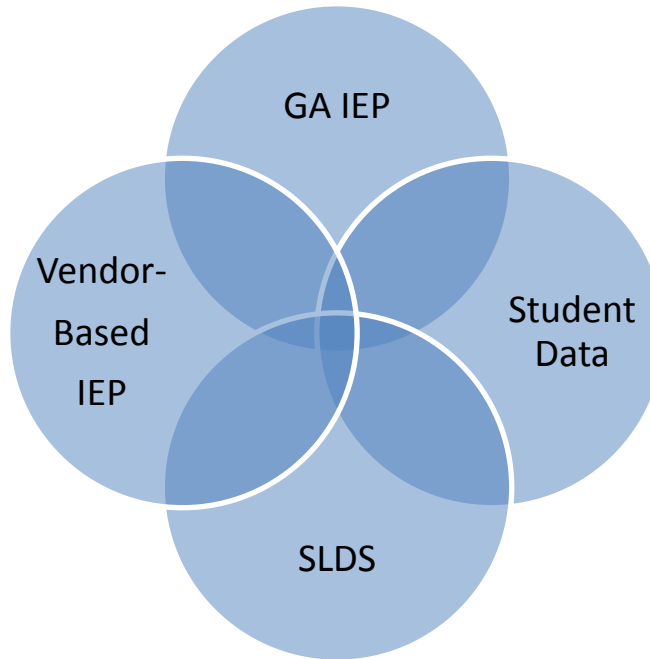
Hierarchy and Flow of Data through GA Online IEP

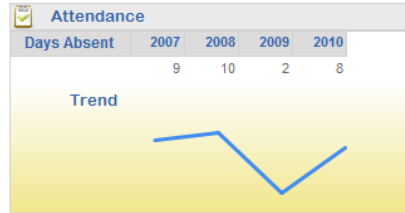

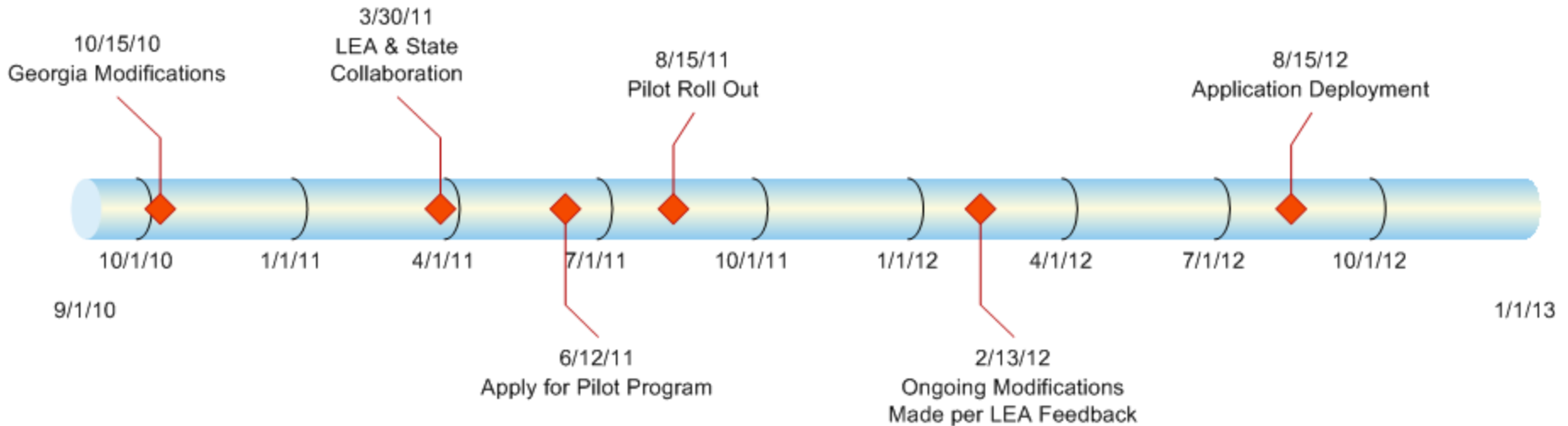
