- 1. If a student is having difficulty with communication his IEP team has instant access to videos related to the topic of augmentative/alternative communication, <u>AAC</u>.
- 2. <u>Online Classroom</u> has 14 video presentations that range from the "ABCs of AAC" to specific device programming support. At the end of each video there is the opportunity to check compentencies related to the video topic by taking the associated quiz.
- 3. Additional training exercises are also provided to increase familiarity with the subject strand. <u>Training Materials</u> address topics such as the Individuals with Disabilities Improvement Act (IDEA), home use of AAC devices, and consent to access private pay sources for device funding.
- 4. <u>Downloads</u> readily accessible help teachers quickly implement technology into the daily classroom environment. These include SmartSheets (descriptions of low to high tech communication devices), and predesigned communication boards.
